As I write this, we are almost 50% done with shipping. We built a strong momentum throughout digging and grading, which has allowed us to maintain our resolve right into shipping. We are about 85% of the way through propagation, as well as, container and field grafting. The field crews have been hard at work in the elements, pruning and tapping the 2 YR top trees. We have almost finished our #7 gallon planting and will be starting our #3 gallon planting next week. Propagation has also begun planting our babies for future production. Our next big task, here at the nursery, will be cutting back cuttings and seedlings to carefully stake; creating future quality trees. We have some exciting new ideas to make this more efficient and to ensure the highest quality product that we can deliver.


## CHIONANTHUS RETUSIS **CHINESE FRINGE TREE**



It's hard to conceive a more beautiful small tree. After the leaves have emerged, lovely fragrant white flowers appear at the terminal of branches. Flowers remain for 2-3 weeks. They cover the outside of the canopy, thus the common name:

Fringe Tree. Pest free and disease free. Leaves
